The third breakout for today does not have CME available at this time but the hope is to get it once approved for enduring CME. • Reminder that to obtain CME, members will need to enter their first and last name and email address in the GoToMeeting people pane. • Rehman and associates previously reviewed MTC policies. Updates were made to the Membership Dues and Payables Policies and approved by Executive Board. • Future MTC sessions held indoors such as meetings, courses, and conferences will require masks regardless of vaccination status, elimination of high touch areas (like buffet style dining) and encouragement of social distancing. <p>A Survey monkey regarding the potential for a mentoring program was previously sent to the membership. 28 responses were received from individuals willing to act as a mentor, 58 responses were obtained for individuals who were interested in being a mentee. MTC will move forward with a mentoring program.</p> <p>It is estimated that 1-2 or 3-4 hours per month may be requested of potential mentors for the program.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Marleen Nowakowski was elected Treasurer- Elect and will become Treasurer in January of 2022. 	
<p>Treasurer Report</p> <p>Chris McEachin</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Committee Chairs please watch your email for budget information requests • Participating member dues are received 50% in beginning of year whereas 50% are at the end of year • Expenditures are lower than normal due to the nature of the year and unpredictable nature of the COVID surges. • ICD-10 course, less was spent than anticipated. • Registrars are now starting to take advantage of the certification reimbursements, keep it up. • Key message is the organization is spending less than anticipated and doing well considering the circumstances. 	<p>All Committee Chairs please reply promptly to all budget information requests from Chris M.</p>

<p>Registry Committee</p> <p>Jane Riebe-Rodgers</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The ESO August Townhall shared a lot of important information related to the future of trauma registries. (ESO is the parent company for CDM/TraumaBase, having previously acquired Digital Innovations, and Lancet.) They are going to sunset Trauma Base, Trauma One and DI with trauma registries moving to a web-based application. This will take some time to implement, and rollout could take a couple of years. This will be hosted as a SaaS (Software as a Service) application. Not all details have been released regarding the roll out, and ESO will be sharing more details at the Wave Conference in April 2022 which will be held in Austin TX. ESO has indicated they would like to start Beta testing in the 4th quarter of 2021. Projected costs for a Level 1 or 2 center will be between \$22,000 and \$40,000 annually. Level 3 and 4 costs are projected to be around \$10,000 and \$24,000 annually. <p>A significant change from the current format to an online platform is that there will not be a limit on user licenses. The goal per ESO is to offer a product that reduces redundancy, improves submission times and allows for a greater focus on quality. There was no information presented on how legacy data will be managed. ESO has posted a recording from the townhall on August 11, 2021. The townhall can also be accessed on their site. The site also contains a survey to get ballpark pricing for your center. Contact ESO if you are interested in applying to be a beta test site.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When hospitals start using AIS 15, AAAM will be charging an annual licensing fee. The amount of that fee has not been disclosed.

Redundancy was identified in Article IV Officers Term with the suggestion to remove a redundant sentence regarding the staggering of officer terms. The Treasurer-Elect position is currently incorrectly listed as a 1-year position instead of 2-year position, suggestion is to restore the 2-year term. The Secretary term was also not listed when updated in the past, suggestion to restore term language for this position. There is also a suggestion to restore language regarding which officers begin their terms in alternating years. Lastly, a Physician-At-Large role description is needed in the bylaws. • The current bylaws also need to incorporate a date change. A motion was made to accept the bylaw changes with understanding that they will be sent out via Survey Monkey. A motion to accept bylaws was made by Nancy Mitchell with a Second by Angela Powless. A Survey Monkey will be sent for voting regarding the proposed bylaws changes. • December Elections: At the December Meeting we will need to elect a new President Elect and Treasurer Elect, both will begin their terms in 2022. <p>MDHHS Bureau of EMS, Trauma and Preparedness</p> <p>Eileen Worden</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 213 Development Grants were supported for trauma within the state. There was a short turn-around time for the grants. Apologies were shared for the short time frame but MDHHS is requesting that those who received grants turn in their final paperwork by the end of the MDHHS fiscal year to facilitate proper reimbursement. If received after the end of the fiscal year, grants will still be reimbursed but not until the 2022 Fiscal year. <p>Trauma funding is being voted on today in the House of Representatives. If the bill does not pass, on October 1st the trauma system will lose 50% of trauma funding.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • STACC terms end December 2021. In the beginning of October applications will be available for potential appointments to the committee. • A pilot for virtual visits for redesignation, tool and guideline documents are still in process, Thanks were given to the 5 pilot facilities. Reports for these facilities will be discussed next week at the designation committee meeting. 	<p>Members who submitted trauma grants are asked to submit completion paperwork by the end of the MDHHS fiscal year.</p>

APPENDIX 1: VIRTUAL VISIT DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS

REQUIRED ASSESSMENT DOCUMENTS

All data and materials must represent trauma activities during the review period consistent with the timeframe (reporting year or as noted) used to complete the online PRQ. The trauma registrar may be asked to extract data from the trauma registry upon the reviewers' request. The program assessment documentations are required at the time of the virtual visit AND provided to the review team 7 days prior to the virtual visit on an encrypted thumb drive, or secured file transfer protocol, or other HIPAA compliant method in PDF format. Program assessment documents must be organized in digital folders based on the categories below.

Documents: Trauma Service folder

- Guidelines/protocols for attending surgeon response to lower activation patients requiring hospital admission (CD 5-16)
- Call and backup call schedules for trauma surgeons for the last 3 months of the reporting year* (*not applicable to Level III centers*)
- Trauma Team Activations (TTA) criteria for all tiers
- Transfer agreements (*only applicable for Level III centers*)
- Non-surgical admission policy
- Massive Transfusion Protocol
- Emergency Department resuscitation guidelines/protocols for trauma patients
- Over/under TTA analysis (e.g. Cribari matrix, NFTI, etc.)
- Current Ongoing Professional Practice Evaluation form used for trauma panelists, subspecialists, and APPs involved in trauma care (e.g. show a completed OPPE for the TMD)

Other Key Documents:

- Report with Ortho and Neuro 30-minute response times
- Report demonstrating radiology response time for emergent MRI & emergent arteriography/embolization
- Screening statistics for Etoh in pts LOS \geq 24 hours for 80% of admitted trauma pts
- Report demonstrating the percent of patients that screened positive and who received a brief intervention, updated to 80% compliance vs all

Research Documents: prior to visit
