Tips for Instructors

1. Register as a new instructor on the <u>www.stopthebleed.org</u> website under the "Get Trained" tab then click on "Become an Instructor". Log-in and edit your contact information via "Instructor Profile".



- 2. Review and download course materials via the Instructor Portal. Note: We're specifically not providing electronic files to you, as Stop the Bleed recommends downloading directly from the website to obtain the most current versions. See the attached "Instructor Resources" list of free materials that are available on the website.
- 3. To use the trademarked Stop the Bleed logo on websites and promotional materials, your group must request permission and sign an agreement with the U.S. Department of Defense via: stopthebleed@hq.dhs.gov
- 4. Teach a Stop the Bleed class! There are two types of classes:
 - a. Instructor/Train-the-Trainer: Per guidelines, all potential Instructors must first complete a B-Con Course. Refer to the list of professionals eligible to become STB Instructors: <u>cms.bleedingcontrol.org/applicant/create</u>
 - b. Basic Bleeding Control (B-Con) Provider: Training for the public and laypersons.
- 5. When teaching a class, remember to:
 - *a. Maintain the minimum recommended Instructor-to-Student ratio for all skills stations of 1:8-10.* If you need help finding Instructors, please contact: <u>mtcinjuryprevention@gmail.com</u>
 - b. Register your class via "Add Class" under the Instructor Portal Dashboard. Note: Click the appropriate box if you want your class to be private vs. listed in the public domain of the STB website.
 - c. Prepare class paperwork (e.g., sign-in sheet, course completion certificates, skills check-off list if helpful). Templates available via the "Instructor Materials" tab in the Instructor Portal.
 - d. Use only approved equipment, as listed on bleedingcontrol.org and in the course guidelines document.
 - e. Utilize a post-course survey. <u>Click here to preview an online example</u>.
 - f. After the class, "Close Class" under your Instructor Portal Dashboard with final attendance numbers.
- 6. Utilize videos, posters, booklet, flowchart, reports, advocacy tools, etc. available under the "Resource Hub" tab.

Virtual Presentation

The STOP THE BLEED[®] Course can be presented virtually. Instructors may present the lecture through a virtual meeting platform utilizing the current presentation. You can elect to use the prerecorded version linked below; however, an instructor must be present through the entire virtual training. Instructors are not allowed to record or host the session on an organization's website, YouTube, or a LMS.

As a reminder, participants must complete both the lecture AND the skills component of the STOP THE BLEED[®] Course to be considered COMPLETE and to receive a certificate of completion. Please make sure this is reflected in the Instructor Portal when you add your courses.

STOP THE BLEED® Virtual Course – Lecture Only*

*Participation in virtual lecture training will be limited to the maximum number of participants your virtual meeting platform will host, there is not a STOP THE BLEED® Course participant limit to the lecture portion of the virtual course. If you are doing the standard, in-person STOP THE BLEED® Course or virtual skills training you must adhere to the 1:10 instructor-to-student ratio and reflect this in the Instructor Portal properly.

STOP THE BLEED® Interactive Course

The STOP THE BLEED[®] Program now offers students the option to fulfill the lecture requirement of the course by completing the **STOP THE BLEED[®] Interactive Course**. This virtual course allows individuals to go through animated videos, diagrams, and quizzes. While the interactive course fulfills the lecture portion, it does not allow them to receive a certificate

of completion until they complete the hands-on skills portion of the course. The interactive course will encourage participants to attend either a full STOP THE BLEED® Course or a Skills-Only STOP THE BLEED® Course to receive their certificate of completion. At the conclusion of the course, they will receive an email with their final quiz results. Participants must show the instructor this document to receive a certificate of completion after they have completed the skills-only portion of the course.

As an instructor, you now can select this as a course type and instruct students to take the interactive course prior to the skills-only portion you will teach—similar to the Virtual Lecture only option. The course is located at **www.stopthebleed.org/training/online-course**. Please make sure to link your course listing to the interactive course page.

As a reminder, participants must complete both the lecture/interactive course AND the skills component of the STOP THE BLEED[®] Course to be considered COMPLETE and to receive a certificate of completion. Please make sure this is reflected in the Instructor Portal when you add your courses.

STOP THE BLEED® Skills-Only Course*

At the conclusion of the virtual lecture-only course, participants will require a reminder to schedule the skills portion to complete the STOP THE BLEED[®] Course requirements. As an instructor you can schedule a skills-only training session through the Instructor Portal and you should indicate if the course is public or private for maximum participation. Bleeding Control Basic (BCon) Course v. 1.0 Instructor Information

The Bleeding Control Basic (BCon) Course v. 1.0 is designed for individuals who have little or no medical training but who may be called upon as immediate responders to provide initial trauma care and bleeding control to a victim of traumatic injury prior to the arrival of emergency medical services (EMS) or in an austere environment.

Bleeding Control Presentation

There is an official, branded PDF presentation that should be used for your civilian training courses. The presentation includes three embedded videos (pages 10, 37, and 53). The videos should play automatically and not require any external links.

The presentation may, from time to time, be updated. Please watch for communications from the Committee on Trauma with updates to the presentation materials.

Who Can Teach the BCon Course v. 1.0?

Instructors for the BCon Course include:

- PHTLS instructors
- PHTLS providers who have successfully completed the BCon Provider Course
- TCCC/TECCC instructors or providers
- ATCN/TNCC instructors or providers who have successfully completed the BCon Provider Course
- Any EMR, EMT, paramedic, RN, PA, or MD who has successfully completed a BCon Provider Course
- Any ATLS instructor or provider who has successfully completed a BCon Provider Course
- Any NAEMT instructor for any other NAEMT continuing education course who has successfully completed a BCon Provider Course

Faculty Requirements

The minimum recommended instructor-to-student ratio for all skill stations is 1:8. Given this ratio, every BCon Course v. 0.1 will require adequate faculty to maintain this requirement.

Eligible Students

Eligible students are any individuals who may be called upon to assist with trauma patients while waiting for first response or EMS to arrive. The course has been designed for students who have received little or no prior medical training. Examples of potential students include teachers, taxi drivers, train station attendants, and Transportation Security Administration (TSA) workers.

While the preferred course for educating law enforcement officers is the Tactical Casualty Care for Law Enforcement and First Responders (TCC-LEFR), the BCon materials may be used to introduce these concepts to law enforcement officers.

Material Requirements

All BCon Course v. 1.0 students should receive a copy of the bleeding control handout and any registration materials.

Equipment and Supplies

All students must have access, at a minimum, to the equipment needed to complete the skill stations. The equipment can either be supplied in each skill station or provided to each group of students. Students should be allowed to use their own equipment when appropriate.

All equipment must be in proper working order.

Equipment includes:

- Personal protective equipment (PPE) (gloves)
- Hemorrhage control devices (tourniquet, gauze rolls)
- Manikin or wound-packing model

Course Plan

Course sites may rearrange the schedule for site-specific needs as long as all of the course elements are included. The course content is available on the provided thumb drive and eventually will be made available for download on the American College of Surgeons (ACS) Bleeding Control website, *bleedingcontrol.org*.

BCon Course v. 1.0 Schedule

- BCon lecture
- Tourniquet single skill station
- Wound packing single skill station

Average course time: Approximately one hour (may be longer as needed)

Successful Completion
